Senior Caucus Legislative Priorities

(Update for April 26, 2023)

Caregiver Work Force Shortage

The Human Services Omnibus bill (now SF2934, author Noor) passed the Senate 4/18/23 and was then passed on the House floor with some amendments on 4/25/23. It then went back to the Senate and was not accepted.

The Senate and House versions have a number of important differences and a conference committee to work out those differences has been requested.

SF2934 includes significant funding for increasing payments for direct care workers, in-home services, and critical access nursing homes including temporary grants for nursing homes, staff retention bonuses related to the SEIU Collective Bargaining Agreement, along with Home and Community Based Workforce incentive grants, New American Long Term Care grants, Underserved and Rural Community Provider Capacity grants and other grant programs.

Increases for Senior Nutrition

The senior nutrition bill (formerly HF2523/SF2244) was included in the Human Services Omnibus bill, SF2934, but now includes only \$4.5 million for senior nutrition for one year only to be available only until June 30, 2025. This is a significant decrease from the original SF2244, which provided nearly \$16 million per year for two years. Authors of the original Senate bill are hopeful that more of the proposed increases are restored in the upcoming conference committee.

Legislative Task Force on Aging

SF1022, establishing a Legislative Task Force on Aging

was referred to the Senate Committee on Rules and Administration on 3/2/23 but it is not clear whether it was heard in that committee. HF0979,the companion bill was and referred to the State and Local Government Finance and Policy Committee on 1/30/23.

Melvin Whitfield Carter Jr., the father of St. Paul's current mayor, is a true son of Rondo, the city's storied African American neighborhood. He was born in



in cultural misunderstanding. Growing up in the 1950s and '60s, he witnessed the destruction of his neighborhood by the I-94 freeway—and he found his way to fighting and trouble. But Carter turned his life around. As a young man, he enlisted in the US Navy. He used his fighting ability to survive racist treatment, winning boxing matches and respect. As an affirmative action hire in the St. Paul Police Department, facing prejudice at every turn, this hardworking, talented, and highly principled officer fought to protect the people of the city he calls home. *Diesel* Heart is the story of a leader who created a powerful family legacy by standing up for what is right, even in the face of adversity.
